Parking at ADF

Parking Passes

For students bringing a car to campus, parking passes are required and can be purchased at check-in. Passes are \$34.50 for the whole festival (\$17.25 for May 25–June 24 and \$17.25 for June 25–July 24). This permit is valid for Duke's East Campus and will also allow parking near the performance venues after 5:00 PM. Student dorms are located on Duke's East Campus. Students can park anywhere on East Campus and will be within walking distance of the dorm.

Tickets & Towing

Parking passes are valid for all unreserved East Campus parking spaces. Any car found parked in a reserved parking spot on East Campus may receive a parking ticket or be towed. ADF is not responsible for parking tickets or towing fees, so students should read all parking signs very carefully! ADF-issued parking passes do not grant students access to park anywhere on Duke's West Campus between 7:00 AM–5:00 PM. Parking on West Campus is available in pay-to-park lots. Students will receive more information about parking at the theaters in their check-in documents. Off-campus studios do not require parking passes.

East Campus

- ADF Students will not be permitted to park in the front-loop portion of the Gilbert-Addoms Lot. This area is reserved for ADF Staff and VIPs.

West Campus

- ADF parking permits are not universally honored on West Campus.
- ADF permit holders access these additional lots during non-business hours. Weekend and evening permit requirements vary by lot. Read specific parking garage and lot access details [here](#).
- All valid Duke permits (including ADF East/Central Campus permits) may access the following West Campus lots 5:00 PM–6:59 AM on weekdays and all day on Saturday/Sunday.
 - Parking near Rubenstein Arts Center 5:00 PM–6:59 AM on weekdays & Saturday/Sunday:*
 - Campus Drive Lots (Gated lot at Campus Drive & Anderson Street and ungated lots along Campus Drive)
 - Parking near Reynolds Theatre & Page Auditorium 5pm-6:59am weekdays, Saturday & Sunday:*
 - Chemistry Lot Gated and Ungated
- Paid parking on West Campus is available during business hours, Mon–Fri, 7:00 AM–5:00 PM.

Additional Parking Information

- Read all parking signs very carefully! ADF is NOT able to help with parking tickets or towing fees.
- DO NOT PARK in reserved parking spaces; you will be ticketed or towed.
- Your East Campus permit does not grant you access to park anywhere on West Campus with the exception of the information listed on [Duke's Interactive Campus Map](#).
- Parking in lots closest to RAC is paid or gated during weekday class times. Free street parking can be found on Alexander and Oregon Street. You are encouraged to park on East Campus and ride the ADF bus.
- Durham School of the Arts does not require a parking pass.

Duke Parking Regulations

- The Duke Parking & Transportation Director will exercise discretion and authority to ensure the proper and effective use and control of the available parking areas and facilities.
- Duke University assumes *no* liability or responsibility for damage to or theft of any vehicle parked or in operation on the properties.
- Vehicles must properly display a current permit for the appropriate area in which the vehicle is parked Mon–Fri, 7:00 AM–5:00 PM.
- Please note that individuals visiting must have a visitor parking permit. These are available in the reception office for \$5/day.
- Individuals issued parking violations and/or related fines may petition the penalty within fifteen calendar days of the date of the citation.

ADF Buses

ADF owns two school buses that provide transportation for performances, classes, and special events.

ADF Performance Bus Schedule:

ADF Bus transportation is provided from East Campus to the performance venue on ADF Student nights only. Pick up is at the Washington Duke Statue (Mr. Duke Statue) starting 1 hour before the performance. The last bus leaves 30 minutes before the start of each performance. Buses run back to East Campus after each performance.

ADF Classes Bus Schedule:

ADF Bus transportation is provided between Rubenstein Arts Center, Arts Annex, East Campus, and Durham School of the Arts during **weekday class times**. Buses run on a tight schedule to deliver students to classes and leave ON TIME. A bus schedule time table will be provided.

Class bus stop location details:

RAC Campus drive in front of RAC building

Arts Annex Campus drive at walking path; at Duke bus stop “Campus Dr at Arts Annex”

Duke Statue Campus Drive at East Campus Quad; at Duke bus stop, “East Campus (Washington Duke Statue)”

DSA Pick-up/drop-off lanes between Media Center and North Duke Street

Duke University Bus

Duke University buses also run during the festival. These are free and can be used to get around Duke campus outside of class and performance times or as a supplement.

C1: East-West travels between East Campus and West Campus Chapel (close to Reynolds and Page) with stops convenient to RAC and Arts Annex. This schedule varies per day of the week.

GoDurham Bus: Bull City Connector

The Bull City Connector goes up and down Main Street. Mon–Fri, 6:30 AM–9:00 PM, and Sat 10:00 AM–9:00 PM. This bus is free and runs every 17 minutes.

It can be used to travel to/from East Campus areas and DSA outside of weekday class times. There are stops at Swift Ave/Main St and Campus Dr/Main St. DSA is on N Duke St, one block from the N Gregson St/Main St stop.

- Start at the Duke Statue.
- Turn left to stay Campus Dr.; heading SW on Campus Dr.
- Cross under W Main Street overpass
- Continue on Campus drive and a walking path to Arts Annex will be on the left.

Durham School of the Arts (DSA) .7 miles

14-min walk; 7-min bike

- Head north on Campus Drive.
- Bear right into Campus Drive loop.
- Turn right toward Epworth Dorm Ln. (Toward Buchanan Blvd.)
- Continue onto W. Trinity Ave.
- Turn right onto N. Duke St.
- DSA will be on the right

Hull Avenue Dance Studio .7 miles

16 mins walk; 6-min bike

- Start at the Duke Statue.
- Turn left to stay Campus Dr.; heading SW on Campus Dr.
- Turn right onto gravel path that runs parallel to W Main Street
- Turn left onto Swift Ave.
- Turn right onto Hull Ave.
- Hull Ave. Studio will be on the left

22-min walk; 7-min bike

- Start at the Duke Statue.
- Turn left to stay Campus Dr.; heading SW on Campus Dr.
- Cross under W Main Street overpass
- The Ruby will be on the right, just past Anderson St.
