

2024 Transportation Guide

Parking at ADF

There are multiple Studio and Performance spaces that require paid parking. You may purchase a Parking Pass that will allow you to park near all venues for \$18.25 and it is good from June 13 – July 13, 2024.

If you are living in the 300 Swift dorm and wish to park in the garage, a permit costs \$36.50 for June 13 – July 13, 2024. This does not cover parking for the Studio and Performance venues as listed above. That is a separate permit.

Parking passes are available for sale at the ADF Store in the Reception area of Gilbert-Addoms.

The following parking options are available without a permit:

- Watts Elementary School street parking in surrounding area
- · Beth El Synagogue street parking in surrounding area
- Rubenstein Arts Center (RAC) there are paid lots at the Nasher Art Museum or Sarah Duke Gardens parking lots.

Free street parking can be found on Alexander and Oregon Streets. Campus Drive lot is open for Pay-to-Park Fridays after 5pm, Saturdays, and Sundays.

• Page Auditorium and Reynolds Industries Theater – paid parking is available at the Bryan Center surface lot and garage

Read all parking signs very carefully. DO NOT PARK in reserved parking spaces; you will be ticketed or towed. ADF is NOT able to help with parking tickets or towing fees.

ADF Buses

ADF Performance Bus Schedule:

ADF Bus transportation is provided from East Campus to the performance venue on ADF Student Nights ONLY. Pick-up is at the Washington Duke Statue (Mr. Duke Statue) starting 1 hour before the performance. The last bus leaves 30 minutes before the start of each performance. Buses run back to East Campus after each performance.

ADF Classes Bus Schedule:

ADF Bus transportation is provided between 300 Swift, Rubenstein Arts Center, Arts Annex, and East Campus during WEEKDAY class times. Buses run on a tight schedule to deliver students to classes and leave ON TIME. A bus schedule time table will be provided.

Class Bus Stop Location Details:

Rubenstein Arts Center (RAC) → Campus Drive in front of RAC building

Arts Annex → Campus Drive at walking path; at Duke bus stop "Campus Dr at Arts Annex"

Mr. Duke Statue → Campus Drive at East Campus Quad; at Duke bus stop, "East Campus (Washington Duke Statue)"

Duke & Durham Buses

Duke University Bus

Duke University buses also run during the festival. These are free and can be used to get around Duke campus outside of class and performance times or as a supplement.

C1: East-West

Travels between East Campus and West Campus Chapel (close to Reynolds and Page) with stops convenient to RAC and Arts Annex. This schedule varies per day of the week.

GoDurham Bus: Bull City Connector

The Bull City Connector goes up and down Main Street. Mon–Fri, 6:30 AM–9:00 PM, and Sat 10:00 AM–9:00 PM. This bus is free and runs every 17 minutes.

It can be used to travel to/from East Campus areas and DSA outside of weekday class times. There are stops at Swift Ave/Main St and Campus Dr/Main St. DSA is on N Duke St, one block from the N Gregson St/Main St stop.

Bus Tracking

TransLoc Rider tracks both Duke University and GoDurham buses.

On a Smartphone

Search for TransLoc Rider in your app store. Download and share your location. Select which routes you want to view, set notifications about when the buses will arrive, and map routes to your desired location.

SMS Text Messaging

Find a bus by texting GOLIVE [stop code] to 41411.
